#### **Regular Board Meeting**

President Charles Flink called the Zoom meeting to order at 7:07p.m. In addition to the BoD members above, Chief Zipp, Marilyn Winters and Jim Solomon & Randy Maschek Secretary, ESD 6 Commission, were in attendance.

**Minutes Approval** – As the first order of business, minutes from the Sep 27, 2021 meeting were presented. Skip Courter made a motion to approve the minutes as presented and Kurtis Wilcox seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

**Treasurer's Report** -President Flink read the Treasurer's Report for Mark Schroeder for the period Jan 1 to Sep 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021. As of Oct 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021, cash on hand is \$ 302,293.25. As of Sep 30<sup>th</sup>, income was 77.5% of budget and expenses were 70.3% of budget through 75% of the year. We have received notification that our Blue Cross medical insurance premiums will decrease approximately 8% in 2022. We budgeted a 15% increase so we will realize some savings assuming all employees continue with the same coverage. There will be no change in the cost of our Long-Term Disability or Dental and Vision coverage. Skip Courter made a motion to approve the report and Kurtis Wilcox seconded. Motion passed unanimously. A copy of the report is attached.

#### **Unfinished Business and General Orders**

1. Fire Chief Report – Chief Zipp reported the BVFD did Fire Prevention Training for Garden Ridge Elementary and two sessions for the Bracken Methodist Church. Breathing Apparatus and Bunker Gear testing/cleaning is on the schedule for completion this month. BVFD is monitoring day-by-day weather reports for the Tropical Storm coming in from the Pacific. COVID cases are leveling out for the country. Scheduling flu shots for fire fighters at BVFD. There was a direct lightning hit on the main radio channel during a recent storm. Replacement crystals/chips are on order so communications have to be on a backup channel. Burn Ban has

been lifted for now. BVFD participated in the Garden Ridge National Night Out, but participation was down from years past.

- 2. Activity Report/ Emergency Rescue Report In the report covering Oct 2020 to Sep 2021, Asst. Chief Anz's report outlined a total of 862 total runs (22% increase from 701), 196 fire calls (15% increase from 170) and 666 rescue calls (25% increase from 531). Total Average emergent fire response was 9:16 minutes and average emergent rescue response was 8:15 minutes. 203 calls were run out of station 2. Report attached.
- **3.** Emergency Services District (ESD) Update ESD 6 Commission Secretary Randy Maschek reported that ESD 6 continues working the inter-local agreement with ESD 2 and 3. They are also working to get ESD 6 mapped accurately in a Sharpefile Format for voting purposes.

#### **New Business**

- 1. **Discuss and take action, if necessary, on plans for the annual Christmas Party.** President Flink asked if having the annual Christmas Party on the first Saturday of December is appropriate for the current Pandemic status, and having Dottie cater it.
- 2. Conduct the annual meeting for the election for the Board of Directors (Flink, Boone, Courter). President Flink reported that all three Directors up for election have agreed to serve another term. Walter Brown moved that all three be re-elected by acclimation. Kurtis Wilcox seconded. 13 present for the general membership meeting voted in favor and zero against.
- 3. Solicit input from annual meeting attendees and take action as necessary. Nothing from the floor.

**BoD Roundtable:** President Flink thanked the Board Members who volunteered to serve again.
